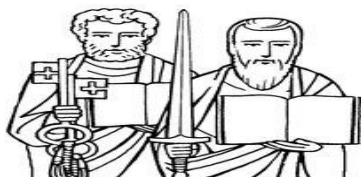

RE-OPENING OF THE CHURCH FOR MASSES

The guidance from the Bishops' Conference about the opening of churches for Mass from 4th July. This guidance is shaped by the Government's scientific advice and Public Health England.

The Cardinal has produced a video which is available on the diocesan website and which will be useful for parishioners. The Cardinal describes that we are not going back to the normal and familiar, emphasising the need for new volunteers and says that Mass in the short-term will be simpler and a bit shorter than usual.

It will be important in these times to help people manage their expectations and recognise that we are not returning to the "old" normal. Mass should not be prolonged.

While the Sunday obligation is suspended, people are encouraged to attend any Mass they wish. With social distancing in place, the numbers attending any particular Mass will be limited. The 2m distancing will be in place.

Congregational singing is not permitted.

After Mass, it will be necessary to clean those areas which have been used. Parishioners should be encouraged to leave promptly.

Here at St. Lawrence's we will be opening our parish for the celebration of **Mass next weekend on Sunday 5th July with an open-air Mass at 10.00am on the grounds of St. Lawrence's school.**

Social distances will be necessary.

Please be patient as sacrifices will have to be made regarding attendance at Mass, keeping in mind that the Sunday obligation is still suspended while this deadly virus is still with us.

Lord Jesus,

when you walked with us on earth you spread your healing power. We place in your loving care all who are affected by Coronavirus. Keep us strong in faith, hope and love. Bring relief to our sick, console our bereaved, protect those who care for us. We lift our prayer to you Lord, and trust in your infinite mercy, as we wait for the daybreak. Amen.
