Dear Friends,

I am almost certain that most of you who are reading this have been both baptised and confirmed. The gifts of the Holy Spirit were bestowed upon us when we received these sacraments and everything we need for our divine lives (the life of God in our souls) was given to us in seed form to be nurtured so we can come to the fullness of life in Christ.

I don't know how many languages are spoken within our parish here at St Lawrences but I'm guessing its quite a few, but language on its own is not always an effective method of communication. Even those of us who only speak one language sometimes struggle to communicate and find difficulty in finding common ground with those who feel a different approach is required.

We live in unprecedented times, and dare I suggest times that transcend languages. Surely at this time rather than at any other time we must stand as humanity and preach the language of co-operation rather than competition, or as it would have been previously called faith, hope and charity. Which of course are themselves are a virtue and virtue is a gift of the Holy Spirit.

On the day of the ascension of Our Lord, when the disciples looked up into the sky, I wonder what they must have been thinking. Ten days later the Holy Spirit descended upon them and the church was born. From these humble beginnings with no money and no infrastructure, we are today (I believe) living on a planet where about one in every seven people is a Catholic.

It is only by the power of the Holy Spirit, gifted to us almost two thousand years ago that this has become possible and of course when we visit places such as Walsingham or Fatima it is great to feel part of something quite special. Equally true though, is that right here in Feltham the Holy Spirit works within us. Every time we undertake a charitable act, and that might be as simple as picking up the phone to another parishioner to check if they are OK, or getting some shopping for a self-isolating neighbour we are strengthened and inspired by the Holy Spirit, and every time we are inspired to pray we are being guided by the Holy Spirit. Remember prayer is the glue that bonds us all together.

**MESSAGE FROM CARDINAL NICHOLS**

The public celebration of Mass in Church will not before July – Churches are likely to be opened for 'individual prayer sometime in June. 'Individual prayer' in the Government's understanding, excludes any formal summons, service, liturgy or blessing. It cannot involve the participation of any minister, nor would it permit a group of individuals to pray in common, e.g. in public recitation of the Rosary. This will be a central condition of opening and crucial in our adherence to regulations on social gathering and distances.

There are important preparations that can begin now such as gathering a team of stewards, preparing the church, thinking about our cleaning routines etc.
