Dear Friends

As we enter this month of August – traditionally a “holiday” month, I hope that you and your loved ones will be able to find some time and space to relax after what has been and indeed continues to be, an extraordinary few months.

Today’s Gospel narrates the miracle of the loaves and the fishes. It shows Our Lord’s thoughtfulness and kindness towards not only the crowd, but to us too. He gives of Himself to us, in Holy Communion; He nourishes and feeds us with His Word, His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. During the coming weeks we should take time for self-care and self-kindness. Many people are now understandably quite tired, just as the crowd was on the lake shore that evening in the Gospel. We should if possible take time to rest awhile with God and if possible, have a change of scene, or activity – something we wouldn’t normally do and so something to look forward to!

This month also has two important feasts – the Feast of the Transfiguration on 6th August and the Assumption on 15th August. At the Transfiguration, the three disciples, Pete, James and John caught the merest glimpse of the heavenly reality of joyful fulfilment. Our Lady, Mother of God and Our Mother too, was spared the pain of death. The Church teaches – and this was dogmatically defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950 that Our Lady “having completed the course of her earthly life was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory”. Her model of quiet acceptance of God’s Will and her motherly care for us, should in these uncertain times, be a source of confidence and consolation. In these days of August, we can ask Our Lady’s prayers for ourselves and indeed for the whole world.

In the meantime, I hope you all have a wonderful August and let’s keep each other in thought and prayer.

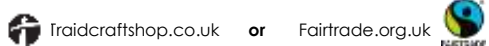

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION NOTICE

First Holy Communion will be on two September weekends: 5th & 6th and 12th & 13th. All Masses will be at 3pm. If you would like to book your child who has completed the First Holy Communion programme last year, please **contact Jordan by email only (see address above)** - include the following information: your name, your child’s full name, how many will attend, which Mass you wish to attend **and** a second choice. Each family has the use of one pew (approx..6 adults plus two small children) to be used as a family ‘bubble’. All others must wait outside the church, where photos can also be taken. I hope you understand why this is necessary. Thank you.

PARISH MASSES

Sunday Masses will be celebrated in the grounds of St. Lawrence School. Open-air Mass at 9.00am and 11.00am, with social distancing.

Weekday Masses Monday to Saturday will be celebrated in church at 11.00am with limited numbers (maximum 64 people with 2 metre distancing). This is a gradual re-opening of our parish for Masses with some changes of Mass times.

It is important to remember that the Coronavirus is still out there, and lives are still at risk. We cannot afford to get complacent. We must all continue to play our part, follow the rules, protect our vulnerable people and control the spread. We are still living with a pandemic.

If someone comes to church and is then tested positive for the virus, the church must be closed for 72 hours.

Certain groups of people may be at risk from COVID19 including those who are aged 70 and above, regardless of medical conditions. If you are feeling unwell, please refrain from coming to Mass.

- The Sunday Obligation is still suspended.
- People who are shielding are currently advised not to attend places of worship
- Masses are still available on websites.
- Confessions by appointments.
- On Sundays we will be celebrating Open Air Masses for the time being.
- Worshippers should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.
- From 24th July people are strongly encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a church.

People want to feel safe and confident when coming back to Mass.
