If you have ever had the experience of doing what is right, but still being a source of blame or dissension, today's readings should give you some comfort.

It seems that it is impossible to please everyone, and even the best act can be a source of condemnation and exclusion. Today's readings illustrate this in the context of faith: what is true and good will not necessarily be welcomed. Thus, in the first reading the prophet Jeremiah is thrown into a well for prophesying the fall of Jerusalem, and in the Gospel, Jesus explains how he himself will be a cause of division - even within families.

Of course, Jesus himself cannot truly be a cause of division. It is not he which divides us, but rather 'the sin that clings so easily'. Every selfish, proud or unjust thought, word or deed – which we all do - is a form of death that separates us, from our true selves, others, and ultimately, from God.

Yet it is not all doom and gloom. Jesus, the good doctor, came to remedy this sad state, and he did not come reluctantly to sort us out, but passionately desiring our good. As a surgeon cauterises a wound with heat, the love of Jesus desires to 'set fire' and cleanse us and our world: as he says, 'how I wish it were burning already!'

How then, are we to grasp this in our lives? The second reading describes how: by grasping the encouragement of all the saints, and by looking to Jesus. I just love it's description of life as a stadium, in which we, the living, are running and being cheered on by all those who have gone before us. These are our 'witnesses', described as a 'great cloud on every side' encouraging us to run and 'not lose sight of Jesus'. The consolation here is that Jesus himself was not unfamiliar with suffering or adversity. When we 'think of the way he stood such opposition', as the reading puts it, we know that He is with us in our own trials – in fact, he has been there before us, and is therefore able to lead us through them.

So we can take heart – as it says, thinking on such things, 'you will not give up for want of courage.'
