Dear Friends

*"O Come thou Key of David come and open wide our heavenly home..."*

This line from the Advent Carol "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" is particularly appropriate on this 4th Sunday of Advent and especially on this 20th December where it forms the Magnificat Antiphon at Vespers as one of the "Great O" antiphons which we use each day at Vespers after 17th December. These antiphons are "titles" for the expected Messiah, starting with "O Sapientia" (O Wisdom) and end with "O Rex Gentium" (O King of the Nations) on 23rd December. This is an especially intense period of Advent preparation, sometimes known as the Novena before Christmas. In this year especially we are in a very unusual time, with the re-introduction of Tier 3 and an uncertain Christmas holiday period.... It seems that our waiting for a return to normality is never ending!

It is precisely now that we need to practice even more than before, the art of living in the present moment. This is not easy, especially when many are tired after a long school term and the continuing uncertainty about jobs and livelihoods. We should, in these uncertain moments turn to Our Lady and St Joseph. We hear little of St Joseph in the Gospels – in theatrical terms his is a mute part – he has no lines. Nonetheless, his role was vital – without him, Jesus would have had no foster father and crucially, going back to that line about the "Key of David", the prophecy could not have been fulfilled that Our Lord would have been born of David's House and line. Joseph is not forced to do anything he doesn't want to, he responds to the Angel in the dream freely. It is the same with us, God offers us opportunities to choose the good and so conform ourselves to His will, but He never forces us. The figures of Our Lady and St Joseph speak of a quiet acceptance of God's Will, even in difficult times. There was no room for them at the inn and they were very soon forced to flee for their lives to a foreign country. All this is to say, that we have two very powerful allies in these two whose prayers and assistance we can and should seek, particularly now.

Christmas will be different this year. It is, however, I suggest, a time when we can rediscover a more authentic and radical understanding of the Christmas message in our own lives. The Incarnation isn't just some historical fact, or statement of belief. It is the coming of Jesus Christ into our hearts in a special way; a coming that brings with it renewal, refreshment and a peace which nothing the world offers can match, because it is a peace which has life and love at its core.

Christ is the King of Nations it is true, but He would also love to be King of hearts too. May this Christmas be one of joy in knowing that Christ conquers all in love and may our hearts be moved to love Him all the more and may they be worthy dwelling places for the King of the World.

## SACRAMENTS

### UPDATE ON COVID RESTRICTIONS FROM BISHOP JOHN SHERRINGTON

**Funerals:** Funerals can be attended by a maximum of 30 people, and it is advised that only close friends and family attend. Linked ceremonial events such as stone settings and ash scatterings can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance. Anyone working i.e. the priest, cantor, organist, pallbearers, stewards, etc. is not included in the 30.

**Baptisms:** Maximum of 6 including the child to be baptised. The priest and stewards are not included in this number.

**Weddings:** From 2<sup>nd</sup> December weddings can take place in Church with a maximum of 15 people in attendance including the bride and groom. The priest and stewards, Authorised Person are not included in this number. Wedding Receptions not permitted whilst in Tier 3.

#### Government Guidelines

As of 16<sup>th</sup> December we are now in Tier 3 - Very High Alert. No mixing of households indoors. Although places of worship are open, one cannot interact with anyone outside of their household or support bubble.

As Boris Johnson has said, "A **limit of three households** has been agreed across the UK for the five-day Christmas period, **"a smaller Christmas is going to be a safer Christmas"**, adding that the three household concessions were "maximums, not targets to aim for".

**NHS COVID-19 Test and Trace App:** On 24<sup>th</sup> September the NHS launched its Covid-19 Test and Trace App. This app has been developed to assist the Government with its test and trace policy and uses a smartphone. The app works by using the 'Bluetooth' system, which all smartphones have. It registers any other phones within a certain distance, which also has the app installed. This takes place between the phones themselves and its entirely anonymous. Please try and use this if you can.
