The Feast of the Purification

Christmastide ends this weekend. In purely practical terms, Christmas seems a very long time ago. It will in fact soon be the fortieth day after Christmas and it is this that marks the end of the Christmas period. Forty days after the birth of her child, a Jewish woman, such as was Our Lady, was expected to go to the Temple and give thanks to God for the birth of the child. Furthermore, she had to redeem the child – the child in theory belonged to God and so the family would offer a sacrifice of A Lamb, or in the case of poorer families, such as the Holy Family, a pair of turtle doves were offered instead. Why is this important? It shows that the Holy Family were observant Jews – that God and the practice of their faith was central to their family life – just as it should be for us.

The custom of carrying candles in procession developed a few centuries later in the East. It became a Roman custom in the latter part of the 7th Century. It is this aspect of the feast that I will consider here.

We are so used to living in a world of “standardised” light, with LED bulbs and neon strips that we have grown used to “conformity” of vision. Candle light – or perhaps more often in the ancient world, oil lamps – is a very different experience. Think of how different another person can look in candle light. We see their features in a different way; some parts are highlighted, other parts are hidden in shadow. Above all, I suggest there is an intimacy, a greater awareness of the other, precisely because of this different appearance. The person is the same, but what we seem to see is different somehow. In the Gospel the old man Simeon says that the “secret thoughts of many will be laid bare”. That is what happens when the Light of Christ shines into our hearts – our thoughts, hopes, fears, joys are all revealed. Truth, beauty and goodness are brought into a wonderfully gentle, yet bright light. I am sure we can think of people who simply radiate joy and happiness – it is a grounded fulfilment and awareness of the wonderful reality that the gift of life is given to us by God each day. Conversely too, we see people whose faces hold only emptiness and despair – the Light of Christ has yet to penetrate, to transform them – or they have chosen to reject His love.

The old man Simeon took the baby Jesus in his arms and blessed God, saying those wonderful words of the Nunc Dimittis “*my eyes have seen the salvation which have prepared before the face of all nations*”. In that moment Simeon, seeing the light in the baby’s face, lights up himself and becomes a prophet. May we too, on this feast, respond to the light of Christ in our sacramental and daily lives, and so become prophets in our own time and be lights in our world, lights of Truth, Goodness, Beauty and Peace, which our world so needs today. That is the call to evangelisation, building up the Body of Christ, the Church of which we are all part.

Let’s pray for each other.
