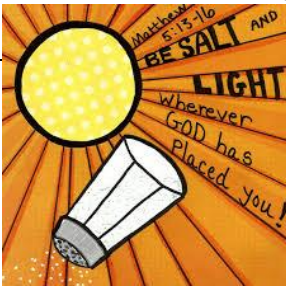

## The Dedication of a Church

Last Saturday I was privileged to attend the Dedication of a newly built Church, in my family's home parish in Borough Green, in Kent. Consecrations of newly built Churches are rather rare these days, so I thought it might be interesting to share the outline of the Rite with you. The responsibility for dedicating Churches in any Diocese lies with the Bishop since he has the "care of the particular Church". In this case, as the parish is in the Archdiocese of Southwark, Archbishop John Wilson, who is known to many of us, from his time in this area of our own Diocese, was the Consecrating Bishop. As Archbishop John pointed out, this was a first for him as well. As the *Praenotanda* for the Rite of a Dedication of a Church makes clear "The rite for a dedication of a Church is rightly considered to be among the most solemn of liturgical services. {Thus} it stands as a special kind of image of the Church itself, which is God's temple, built from living stones".

The Consecration takes place during Mass. Before Mass, the tabernacle is emptied, the altar is left bare. As the Instruction points out: "The Altar of a Church, around which the holy people gather to take part in the Lord's sacrifice and to be refreshed at the heavenly meal, stands as a sign of Christ Himself, who is the priest, victim and the altar of His own sacrifice".

The Consecration liturgy takes place after the Creed and consists of the Prayer of Dedication and the Anointings. The relics are placed in an opening in the altar which is then sealed up after which is said the Prayer of Dedication, calling to mind the life of the Church and the Sacramental life which is and will continue to be celebrated there: "Lord send your spirit from heaven to make this church an ever holy place and this altar a ready table for the sacrifice of Christ. Here may your children gathered around your altar celebrate the memorial of the Paschal Lamb and be fed at the table of Christ's Word and Body." (From the Prayer of Dedication).

The Altar is then anointed with Sacred Chrism in four corners and then in the middle with the sign of the Cross. The four walls of the Church are anointed – these remind us of the four Gospels and the four corners of the world. The Church is not simply a building or place – it is from there that we go out to evangelise "go out to the whole world, proclaim the Good News". In most Churches you will find four consecration candles on the four walls where the anointings are made. It is customary to light these on the anniversary of the Church's dedication. The Chrism is spread across the altar and then the altar is incensed before being dressed in the usual way with altar cloths and candles, both in the usual place and at the place where the consecrations were made and Mass continues as usual.

To be present at the consecration of a Church reminded me of how successive generations of the faithful are connected through the celebration of each and every Mass. In our own parish the Church and High Altar were consecrated by Bishop Gerald Mahon during Mass at which Cardinal Heenan presided, on 12<sup>th</sup> November 1971. On the anniversary of this great event in the life of our parish, we can remember the countless numbers who have worshipped here and contributed to the life of our community and look forward in joy as a community strengthened and nourished by Word and Sacrament.
