Racial Justice Sunday

"Jesus came down with the Twelve to where there was a large gathering ... of people from all parts of Judaea and from Jerusalem and from the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon."

Bridge builder leaders are always a great blessing to have in times and places where there is lack of meaningful cooperation among people with diverse thoughts and ways of life, which can sometimes be crippling. Jesus is always a perfect example for humanity to emulate - Christians and non-Christians alike. He walks the talk. He doesn't just tell people, even enemies, to love one another, he loves and shows himself a uniting force.

The culture in which he was brought up forbade him from mingling with people from outside his own culture because they were seen as enemies of his people and 'unclean'. Of course he did not allow himself to become a slave of his culture's preconceived and ill-thoughts about people from outside his Jewish race. He saw himself, not one to give credence and inflame his culture's intolerance of others, but a bridge builder and a uniting force. That we see in the Gospel passage as he reaches out in no less way to people from the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon - a non-Jewish territory, as he did his own kinsmen and women.

This inclusivity and character of fairness of Jesus fits well for our reflection on this weekend. It reiterates the fact that we were all made of the same divine stock - "In the Image and Likeness of God" - which is the theme for this year's Racial Justice Sunday. It reminds us that regardless of our different colours, that we have all come from the one Father and therefore, one family (Ephesians 4:6) This inclusive action of Jesus is an invitation to each one of us to re-examine how welcoming we are of other people, especially from different cultures to ours. Do our actions and words help to further cohesion in our communities and uphold the equality of all people before God? Or do they encourage intolerant behaviours, promote discrimination and racial injustice?

In this Sunday's Gospel passage, we see in Jesus that truly people from diverse cultures - Jews and non-Jews - can come together; that the same message of redemption and goods of the earth are meant for all peoples to access. He reached out to everyone and saw them as his brothers and sisters. (Matthew 25:40) He gave equal opportunity to all to reach God the Father and access the salvation he brings. Cultural diversity was never a barrier to his mission to save all peoples, but of the richness of God's Kingdom.

The richness of the prayer and the vibrant religious life in our parish community is indeed a blessing and the beauty of God's ingenuity, who has brought us together from diverse cultures. For this, we must give thanks because truly, we are a 'united nations' parish and there is always a place for everyone in this place.
