As this is my first reflection of the new year could I take this opportunity to wish you all a happy, prosperous and healthy 2022. I would also like to thank you for the many Christmas cards and gifts that were given to me over Christmas. Your generosity quite frankly is overwhelming.

As well as celebrating the new year on January 1st we also celebrated the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and it is perhaps with this in mind we should read today's gospel, (The Wedding at Cana) which is perhaps one of the best known of all the gospels, where Jesus changes the water into wine.

Mary has a really important role in today's gospel in the way that she (to use modern parlance) bugs Jesus to get his act together and do something, to which Jesus says "Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not yet come". This tells us that she didn't know everything, and in a similar way we don't know what Gods plans are for us, but if we ask Jesus to intercede for us just as Mary did, sometimes this causes The Lord to work miracles on our behalf.

When Mary instructed the servants to do what Jesus asked, he responded by telling them to fill the stone jars with water. I can only guess at how much they must have weighed, they certainly would have been very heavy and they wouldn't have had the benefit of a modern fork lift truck to assist them, or to put it another way it would have been really hard work.

Being a Christian and particularly a Catholic Christian is hard work. I'm sure that all of you reading this will have struggled at some point, (I know I have). But it is only when you put in the hard work, perhaps spiritual hard work, improving your prayer life or working within the church, that the work will prove fruitful. Sometimes this can be difficult, it might mean working with people we would rather not be working with, however if we do this work with faith inspired by the Holy Spirit, then Jesus will surely turn our water into wine.

#### **Gospel Motivation for John 2:1-11**

"If you have ever been to a wedding, you will know the excitement and anticipation of sitting together with the other guests before the ceremony starts, waiting for the bride to arrive. We are in a similar situation now as we prepare for this moment of Lectio. Our eternal bridegroom is about to reveal himself to us in his Word. Let us sit with that excited anticipation for a moment.

In the Gospel we are about to read, we will see Jesus' first sign that he is not just human, but also God. And he is a God that not only provides for us, but chooses to give us the very best of the best. He chooses to give his very self to us. We must prepare ourselves now to meet this bridegroom. With careful attention let us focus our gaze upon him. Let us open our hearts to welcome his Word. Do not let this special moment pass you by. Behold, here he comes."

**Peace Sunday** follows the International World Day of Peace and is celebrated in the England and Wales on the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. The theme taken from Pope Francis' message for the 55<sup>th</sup> World Day of Peace: *Dialogue between generation, Education, Work and Dialogue: Tools for Building lasting peace.* 

The National President for Pax Christi (the international Catholic movement for peace), Archbishop Malcolm McMahon of Liverpool says:

'This year has been one of unprecedented and continuing challenges. We are all conscious of the need to restore and rebuild our communities here and around the world, accepting that we need new way of working and relating to each other.
