Dear Friends

I don't suppose that for a moment any of you will need reminding that next Friday the United Kingdom will be leaving the European Union. Like all major changes in our lives and circumstances this does give us an opportunity to reflect on our current situation and how we, both as individuals and as a community of Catholic Christians, will adapt to this new reality.

This statement from the Bishops' Conference on Catholic Social Teaching was published in 1996. Their document "The Common Good", contained an important section on the issue of Europe (sections 99-101): Quite frankly, I believe this could have been written yesterday!!

"The Church's social teaching also applies internationally. One of the most important issues facing this country is its future relationship with the rest of Europe - and not just with the European Union. The history of the whole continent is intimately tied up with the history of Christianity. Although all European states are pluralist societies, the churches still have a crucial role in safeguarding and promoting the moral and spiritual values which gave Europe its soul. Those values, which Christians share with other faiths, are essential if the continent is to regain its moral health and spiritual vitality. Solidarity and subsidiarity are two principles which should govern relations between individual states and the wider international community. Solidarity is expressed at many levels - family, neighbourhood, region, nation, the continent itself, and the whole planet. Local loyalties and commitments are important and should be fostered, but they should not be set in opposition to these wider expressions of solidarity. It is possible to be both British and European. The principle of subsidiarity applies particularly to Britain's relations with the European Union, especially the extent to which social, financial and monetary decisions ought to be made at European Union level or national level, or devolved further to regional or local assemblies. There may well be legitimate differences over which arrangements are most likely to respect the principles of solidarity and subsidiarity, and promote the European common good. But those principles cannot be set aside in this current debate."

In today's second reading Paul illustrates for us that division is nothing new. At this moment in time, it is us who are disagreeing amongst ourselves, and therefore it is us who need to find a way to be united again in our belief and practice. As Christians, and particularly as Catholic Christians, we are all called to the principle of solidarity, that is to commit ourselves to the common good to love our neighbours as we love ourselves, and perhaps to reflect that none of us have been baptised either in the name of Britain or the European Union (or for that matter any other country or institution) but all of us have been baptised in the name of Christ, and with our baptism remember that we are one Body of Christ, but at the same time respectful of each other's gifts and talents.

At this time of change please take a moment during the week in your prayer lives to pray for unity both amongst different Christian traditions but also humanity.
