CCTV IN OPERATION

THE GREAT MYSTERY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST.

Dearest in Christ, today as we celebrate the mystery of the Body and Blood of Christ, the Church invites us to reflect on the richness of the Eucharist, and how we have been participating in it.

Our Lord Jesus before leaving the World, promised to be with his Church till the end of time. Then, to confirm his statements, he sacrificed himself both Body and Blood, not just on the cross but mostly at the Altar, through the institution of the Holy Eucharist. Christ made clear that we shall have life in full, only by the reception of his body and blood worthily.

Therefore, as food and water are necessities for our bodily survival, so also the Eucharist is a necessity for the survival of our souls. By receiving the Eucharist, we are able to welcome the presence of Christ in our lives. When Christ is living in us, and we live in him, he fortifies us by his grace, and this fortification empowers us to defeat our immoralities and other weaknesses that are opposing our daily lives as children of God. Our participation in the Eucharist will be merely effective depending on our worthiness. That is why it is always necessary for us to prepare ourselves worthily before approaching for the reception of the Eucharist.

Hence, there are some considerations we need to put in mind before going for reception of the body and blood of Christ, which includes the examination of one's conscience to see if one is in a state of grace. It is a grave sin, even more sacrilegious for one to receive the body and blood of Christ in a sinful state. What this means, is that one is expected to go for confession and obtain the ablution of his or her sin before approaching to receive the Eucharist.

In conclusion, St. Paul while preaching on the effectiveness of the Eucharist, explained that, in reception of the Eucharist, everybody received the same thing, but the benefits might not be the same, because as it gives life to those that received it worthily, likewise it gives death to those that received it in unworthy state.

May God grant us the spirit.

The new Lectionary will use both the English Standard Version (Catholic Edition) and the Abbey Psalter for the Psalms.
