CCTV IN OPERATION DEFIBRILLATOR IN CHURCH PORCH Dear Friends,

Could I just use this opportunity to say a heartfelt thank you for your many messages of condolence, sympathy cards, Mass cards and prayers following the recent death of my dad, Frank Macken. They have been a huge source of comfort to myself and my family at this difficult time. I know that many of you knew him. He moved to Feltham in 1961, and has served our parish community in several different capacities in the years that followed. His energy for parish committees (particularly Gift Aid), and school fundraising (he organised the Christmas fair in the 1970's), didn't really ebb until recently when ill health started to get the better of him, and even then he read at the 11:00am Mass until last year.

My dad was devoted to his Catholic faith, and to his family but it would be fair for me to point out that when it came to gardening he was perhaps a bit less enthusiastic. He often said "I love gardens, I just hate gardening".

In today's Gospel, we might be forgiven for thinking that the message is for reluctant gardeners, All you have to do is plant the seed and let nature do the rest. And as if by magic the seed sprouts and grows and then before we know it the shrub is the biggest of them all, so big that even birds can shelter in its shade.

I know there are times when we are all a bit reluctant to get involved but, however small our effort, somehow the crop will grow anyway. Whatever our difficulties, as we share in the celebration of the Eucharist, we are able to renew our confidence in the reality of the Kingdom of God and in the one who is coming and who will not delay.

Grace is all, in the words of Saint Paul, "We are always full of confidence." But look again and it is one of judgement and challenge. If the farmer is God, then he is about to harvest the crop. God may appear to be sleeping but judgement is coming. The reaping is a symbol of judgement. The mustard plant that takes over the land and attracts the birds will undermine the way things are. Whether the harvest is threat or promise depends on us rather than on God. The harvest is coming anyway. As Paul tells us the truth about us when he states "we will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he or she deserves". So which interpretation of the parables do I follow, grace or judgement? In his time here on earth my dad followed both, and equally we need to respond in a similar way while we still have the time.
