Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last Sunday we looked at two of God's most beautiful gifts: the *Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation*. They are called gifts, because are conferred on those who bring nothing of their own. If you remember I told you that Baptism is the way in, *the door of the spiritual life*. Through baptism we become much more than just *followers* or *imitators* of Jesus; we become **members** of His Mystical Body; we share in Jesus own relationship with the Father, and so grafted onto Christ we are drawn into the very dynamics of the inner life of God. We become God's own beloved sons and daughters. However, as we know, it's not difficult, but impossible to keep authentically such relationship with God by any effort of our own. So God sends incessantly to our aid his Spirit (of course, if we honestly ask him) to encourage and help us keep such Christian dignity unstained and the flame of our faith alive. The Holy Spirit through the Sacrament of Confirmation comes to strengthen and protect in us the grace we received through Baptism.

This weekend we are considering another of God's magnificent gifts: the *Sacrament of the Eucharist*. The Church teaches us that participating in the Sunday Mass is so essential to our Christian life, since we not only participate in the Lord's passion and death and so come to partake of his risen body and blood, but we also come to be what we truly are: **the body of Christ**. This should impel us then to prepare ourselves well before Mass through silence and examination, and praying for his gracious help in the cleansing of our soul, so that he may make us worthy to receive him worthily. And then once we have received Him, let us not leave him alone and go about our business and take no more notice of him. Let us rather by devout prayer talk to Him and hear what our Lord speaks within us.

Moreover, what is most assuring to me is when we say that Jesus is **really, truly and substantially** present under the forms of bread and wine. How can we understand this? It's the great mystery of our faith and to reach full-undoubted certainty it will be very hard. But I do remind you that whenever Jesus speaks or says something in the Gospel, reality changes: *the five loaves of bread are multiplied; the water turned into very good wine; Lazarus come out and the dead man came out; My son your sins are forgiven* and by God his sins are forgiven. Jesus words affects reality.

So when Jesus pronounces the words of sacrifice at the *Last Supper*: **this is my Body**, taking the bread; **this is the chalice of my blood**, over the cup; just describing something? Just engaging in symbolic speech? No, no, if it's Jesus speaking then what he says – **IS**. Therefore we firmly believe that this blessed sacrament is not a mere sign, or a representation, or token of that Holy Body and Blood of Christ, but that Jesus Christ is **really, truly and substantially** present in our midst, and by His own almighty power and unspeakable goodness consecrated and given to us. May God bless you all!
