This week's rich breadth of Scripture prompts me to focus on the Gospel, to allow a deeper, more reflective gaze.

Many of us will be familiar with the account of 'The Woman at the Well' (Jn 4:5-42), as the story of a woman who must have been a social outcast (why else fetch water at the hottest time of day? – nobody else would be at the well). We know of her 'colourful' history: a woman who has been with five men, and not necessarily married. We remember that she was a Samaritan – an outcast people, shunned by the Jews.

Perhaps this woman needs to be re-habilitated in our minds. Her conversation with Jesus is the longest Gospel account of *any* conversation Jesus had, be it with religious leaders, friends, followers or family. It therefore must be immensely important.

Before we judge the woman, let us consider that, in an age of warfare, famine and disease, her multiple relationships may have been merely practical. Without a man, a woman in such a society would be destitute and vulnerable. Her position is, therefore, shameful more for its grinding constraint and poverty in lack of personal choice and dignity: she is a commodity.

As such she is truly one of the 'anawin', the outcasts and the helpless. Yet in this account, she has all of Jesus' attention, time, and conversation. In contrast to their quick repartee, the words of the disciples appear slow and dull. She can engage Jesus in a way they cannot. She sees and understands more than they to – 'I wonder if he is the Christ?'

Jesus sees her for who she truly is, an outcast in social terms, but truly 'blessed' in terms of the Beatitudes. She is 'poor in spirit', yet she becomes an 'apostle', an evangelist, since 'many Samaritans... believed in him on the strength of the woman's testimony'.

We may ask ourselves: who do we discount because of their gender, race, belief, lifestyle? This Lent let us pray to see and affirm others as Jesus did.
