Dear Friends

Last Sunday morning was a real eye-opener for some of our visitors from the life changing charity, Mary's Meals. They were amazed at the number of people at Mass and, wait for it, by how well we sang. It's true, we certainly love to sing here, and it's worth remembering that every hymn is a prayer – even the great St Augustine wrote that "he who sings prays twice!" One of my own personal favourites, and I know this would be true of many of you, is that beautiful and powerful confession of my faith in God's great faithfulness, Amazing Grace: "Amazing Grace, how sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost but now I'm found, was blind, but now I see." It is a hymn that speaks to and speaks for many of the changing scenes of life, its words speaking from deep down inside. Written in the late 1700's, by the sailor turned slave-trader turned Anglican priest, John Newton, it tells the story of one man's conversion, and in just a few verses proclaims the eye-opening and life-changing power of faith. I am reminded of some beautiful words I once read, "tears, always tears in the presence of my God; tears of sorrow for what I am, tears of joy for what thou art." The words of Amazing Grace were written two hundred years ago. They could as well have been sung two thousand years ago by the central figure next to Jesus in today's Gospel, the man born blind. Jesus Christ opened his eyes and changed his life so that he could see clearly the wonder and beauty of his own reflection, the beauty all around him and, as he looked on the face of Jesus, the beautiful face of God. That one saving encounter when the Lord opened his eyes opened his soul to the gift of faith: 'Lord, I believe', the man said, and he worshipped him. Faith is like that, our reaching out for God and God reaching out to touch us. A beautiful and daily prayer could be, "Lord, that I may see". That prayer can change everything. In the Encyclical letter to the Church, *Lumen Fidei* (The Light of Faith), started by Pope Benedict and finished by Pope Francis, we are taught that "faith does not merely gaze at Jesus but sees things as Jesus himself sees them, with his own eyes; it is a participation in his way of seeing." Perhaps today make your own the words of an ancient prayer, "God be in my head and in my understanding, God be in my eyes and in my looking, God be in my mouth and in my speaking, God be in my heart and in my loving."

With my love and prayers for you all, especially all Mothers on this your special day.
