*Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,*

Today, *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*, the Church puts before us the great need for vocations to the Priesthood, to the Missionary, the Religious, the Monastic and the Contemplative Life, but also to the Married life.

Do you have a vocation? A calling from God? Of course you do! In Christianity there are only two basic vocations, both positive: **Marriage** or **Celibacy** and both of them will lead us to a greater calling that is **Holiness**. Thus, in the Church no one is called to be half-married or half-celibate; no one is called to be a bachelor or a spinster. Each one of us has to work out the mystery of God's will for us. Mystery doesn't mean something we cannot understand. Mystery simply means "*plan*". We have to discover God's plan for our lives.

So how does God reveal his plan? How do we discover the "*will of God*" for us? How? I think simply through events and circumstances; through our temperament and personality; through our longings and inspirations. Above all, through facts. God speaks through facts. For all this we need the grace of discernment. Discernment comes through prayer and the Word of God. But also through "*direction*". We all need to seek some kind of "spiritual direction" – whatever our vocation in life may be. Only then we will understand that those who remain single are not failed people who unfortunately could not find anyone to marry, but they are called by God to lead chaste lives and witness to God's love and beauty in the world. This is also true for those who because of their sexual orientation cannot marry. In the fact of their homosexuality God calls them to a chaste life, with chaste love and friendships. Only the grace of God can make such a life possible: the same grace of God that makes fidelity in marriage possible, and fidelity to the religious vows of poverty, chastity and obedience.

Many people – even YOU – may experience a call of God. Some quite young, others quite old. But they feel "*unworthy*". They think their past sins or present failings, disqualify them. This is a trick of the Devil! Take a good look at the Bible and you will see that God calls all kinds of men and women who were certainly not models of holiness, purity and love. Because God calls people, not for their wonderful virtues, but rather for the plan He has for them. First God calls. Then God converts us. We are not called because we

are already converted. With the call comes the grace for a change of life. Slowly at first. In fact, slowly all the time. In my personal experience, I can confess that the calling to serve was neither my first nor even my second nature, and yet, I am ordained to serve. And **God is faithful**, because he gives me everyday the grace to face life with all its troubles and to make the right decision. Courage, your lives will change when God acts and you do not resist his action. Your lives will change when God calls and you do not ignore his calling. Your lives will change when God chooses and you do not reject his choice.

Today we pray that when the Lord acts, here in Feltham, you will not resist his action! And when the Lord calls, you will not reject his choice! Meanwhile you will be very relieved to know that not all priests are like me. Priests come in all shapes and sizes. Some of us are nice. Some of us are very nice indeed. And some of us are not nice at all! This is to assure us that God is not a selection committee. If he were, I would not be writing this now. God chooses whom he chooses. God could even choose you. Yes, you! Listen to God's call today. There is no need to be afraid. If God risks on you, then risk on Him.
