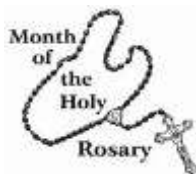

“You must love one another. By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples.”

Laws can sometimes appear to be a burden that limits our freedom, and worse still, a COMMANDMENT! And yet, for any institution or association to make any objective impact in people’s life, it must not only have a vision, but also a guideline to help it remain on course.

In this Sunday’s Gospel, dubbed ‘The Farewell Discourse’ Jesus, on the night before his death, tells his disciples that the only way for them to effectively spread his name, and therefore his mission of salvation for all, is by living the law of love. This model of love has a unique character of selfless service and self-sacrifice for the good of others. Jesus did not just command his disciples to love one another. He taught them this by washing their feet, though he was their Teacher and Master – a role meant for servants in ancient times. He also taught them the true meaning of selfless love by his consistent obedience to his Father’s will, even to dying on the cross to save the world.

Christ’s law of love which he commands his disciples to embrace if they are to make his name known, also reminds us not only of the dignity but also the responsibility that comes with bearing the name – Christian. It with this idea in mind that Jesus said to his disciples: “You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hid. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.” (Matthew 5:14,16). And so, the only credible way to demonstrate we are children of Love is through deeds of love. It is in this way that we can help signpost others to God.

As I reflected on this theme of selfless love, what came to mind was the love, the help with shopping and various other supports initiatives that people in various streets came up with. Even reaching out to people living on their own or others who ordinarily wouldn’t have had people check up on them pre-Covid. I thought of the selfless services of health care and medical workers, some of whom came out from their retirement, so that they can help save lives, even at the risk of their own lives. And some sadly lost their own lives in the process. Although it was a very grim and frightening time, seeing the love and care for others that characterised the period, one felt the sense that “God does indeed live among men and surely makes his home among them.” Frightened as I was then the very first time I went into a Covid ward to anoint a dying patient, the dedication of medical workers that I saw on the ward put a fresh heart into me; and needless saying, courage.

Of course, there is as much need to spread the pattern of Christ’s love to continue to transform our families, communities and our world now as there was over two thousand years ago. We must not forget those deeds of love and kind, shown in such a tremendous way during the pandemic, but strive to perpetuate them since it is only selfless care and love for others that can make the world a truly better place.
