### Eternal Rest

Remembrance of the Holy Souls  
during the month of November

This week's Gospel is familiar to us all as a story of repentance, and the generous love of Jesus when he meets Zacchaeus, the greedy tax collector. This is how I present the story to our First Holy Communion children, to prepare them for the sacrament of Reconciliation. However, in the light of recent events in the Church, I suggest we can also read this story from another perspective, and enlarge what it says to us.

This past month, a synod of the bishops of Latin America has been held in Rome. It has been called the 'Amazon Synod'. The focus of the Synod was on the rights and pastoral needs of indigenous people, and also on ecological problems, especially the destruction of the rainforest.

Uniquely, the discussion of the pastoral needs of people – many of whom cannot receive the sacraments for months or even years, because of the scarcity of priests, and huge distances to be covered – was placed within the context of the environmental crisis. The stark realities of the relatedness of spirituality, spiritual care and the environment are evident.

The deliberate destruction of God's creation is a sin. The world is not a morally neutral context in which we humans act. We are related to it intimately, as we too are created by God, and exist in and through its being: we breathe, eat and live in lands and seas that are God's first, and ours by gift.

Returning to Zacchaeus: as a taxman his relationship to his fellow townspeople was exploitative. He took much more than he needed, and more than they could afford to give. He wrecked their lives, ruptured his relationship to them, and damaged his own soul in the process. The implication is that what we do to people can either build or wreck our relations with them. By extension, our relation to the world, to all that God has given us to cherish, also depends on our respecting it, and never exploiting it.

What can we do? Clearly, the greed that drives exploitation is destructive. Let us choose to live simply. Let us see if we, like Zacchaeus can re-connect with others and our world, by paying back what we owe.
