#### Dear Friends

As I write this reflection, the recent presidential election in the USA is still being disputed by the incumbent and those who are close to him. Only time will tell how the historians of the future will write about our times, and the events that have shaped the last five years or so.

Historians will always disagree about the principle forces that shape history, some will emphasise the importance of hero's, whilst others prefer to talk about the role of the underdog or the poor and the marginalised. One thing in my mind is certain though, and that is that history is shaped by those with exceptional gifts. Whilst this point of view can be disputed, it can certainly be argued that it is the masses of individuals exercising their power of choice which is the real shaper of history.

It is critical for mankind, that ordinary people make their ordinary lives a thing of value by exercising in a heroic way, their unnoticed gifts in unremarkable circumstances. The ordinary person, who is extraordinarily good may appear to have limited impact on the world but he or she certainly shows the way for the countless other ordinary people who make up 99% of humanity. If everyone had the ambition of being good then how wonderful would our planet be?

The plan of God (perhaps we could say the plan of Our Lord of History) is saying to us, that each and every one of us is critical to the fulfilment of His divine plan, we all of us matter a great deal and here on Earth we shall never know the ramifications in Gods sight and the workings of his providence.

As we heard in today's gospel the servant who received the one talent done nothing and was berated by his boss and thrown out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth.

In modern parlance I would say that seems a bit harsh, perhaps the servant considered burying the talent as the best way of guarding his employer's property. That in itself doesn't matter so much, but what does matter enormously to God, is that no matter how modest our talents and circumstances are, we apply ourselves to the wheel of life and do Gods will as it presents itself to us in everyday life

The call to personal holiness is universal. Does the world need more people like the master in today's gospel or does it need more saints? Well of course we need more saints. But these are saints in ordinary households and in ordinary work settings. We do of course need saints in leadership as well, for example Pope St John Paul II, but what we really need is what Christ stresses, the vast stream of one talent people taking up the core of goodness and carrying through to the very end. Unbeknown to most others but well known to the one who matters.

#### UPDATE ON COVID RESTRICTIONS FROM BISHOP JOHN SHERRINGTON:

**Funerals:** Funerals can be attended by a maximum of 30 people, and it is advised that only close friends and family attend. Linked ceremonial events such as stone settings and ash scatterings can also continue with up to 15 people in attendance. Anyone working i.e. the priest, cantor, organist, pallbearers, stewards, etc. is not included in the 30.

**Weddings:** From Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> November, no weddings can take place unless in exceptional circumstances.

**NHS COVID-19 Test and Trace App:** On 24<sup>th</sup>September the NHS launched its Covid-19 Test and Trace App. This app has been developed to assist the Government with its test and trace policy and uses a smartphone. The app works by using the 'Bluetooth' system, which all smartphones have. It registers any other phones within a certain distance, which also has the app installed. This takes place between the phones themselves and its entirely anonymous. Please try and use this if you can.
