'Do not worry about anything'

In the film 'Bridge of Spies', Mark Rylance gives a wonderful performance as a Russian agent accused of spying in 1960's America. When briefed by his lawyer on the gravity of his situation – he could face the death penalty - he is asked, 'Aren't you worried?' He replies, 'Would it help?'

Today, St Paul tells us 'Do not worry about anything' – It is a challenge to take these words at face value. The current health crisis, and with all the pressures – financial and personal – that flow from it, are very concerning. Like the spy in the film we are in a serious situation. However, like him, we should also ask if worrying actually helps us at all.

Worry saps our energy, disturbs our thoughts, and, ultimately, takes away our peace to such an extent that we can neither judge our situation rightly, nor find strength and joy in the many good and positive things that are ours. The first of these is the nearness and tender love of God our Father.

Paul's advice to pray and to seek and do good in all situations, is the remedy to the desolation described in the other readings, all of which describe vineyards laid waste. The image of a vineyard does not just apply to the people of Israel, but is also a metaphor for our souls, and a very apt seasonal image too! The expected fruitfulness of the vines is an image that both Jesus and St Paul apply us: 'by their fruits shall you know them'. These refer to both spiritual fruits and good deeds.

This is seasonally apt in two ways: it is autumn, when we expect to see harvests, and in our parish, last weekend Fathers John and John Louis confirmed 73 young people. Completing their initiation into the Church, Confirmation is a sort of in-gathering, or harvest. Let us pray that by the power of the Holy Spirit, their lives may be fruitful in good deeds and rich in spiritual growth. May they be a blessing to their families, schools and parish!

Also, this is my last contribution to the newsletter before I stand down later this month. Thank you again to all whose fruitfulness in kind and wise words and deeds have made my time of service in St Lawrence's parish so blessed. Your many kindnesses will bear fruit, please God, wherever I go next!

MASSES

- Saturday 6pm Vigil Mass for Sunday in **Church only**.
 - Sunday 9am **Church and the Parish Centre**
 - Sunday 11am **Church and the Parish Centre**
 - On Saturdays there will be Confessions at 10.30am and during Confessions there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in church each Saturday. Mass will be at 11.00am.
 - Weekday Masses Monday to Saturday will be celebrated in church at 11.00am with limited numbers
- Two metre distancing and everyone over the age of 11 should wear masks unless exempt and have proof of exemption.

UPDATE ON COVID RESTRICTIONS FROM BISHOP JOHN SHERRINGTON:

Funerals: The recent guidance states that the number allowed to gather for a funeral liturgy remains at a maximum of 30. It states explicitly that this does not include those who are working; this will include the priest, cantor, organist, pallbearers, stewards etc. Hence the number of attendees permitted is 30.

Baptisms: From Monday 28th September, the number of people attending the baptism liturgy outside of the normal pattern of worship is limited to 6 attendees.

Weddings: From 28th September, the maximum number attending a wedding liturgy is limited to 15 attendees, which includes the bride and groom. Those working are not included in the 15.

NHS COVID-19 Test and Trace App: On 24th September the NHS launched its Covid-19 Test and Trace App. This app has been developed to assist the Government with its test and trace policy and uses a smartphone. The app works by using the 'Bluetooth' system, which all smartphones have. It registers any other phones within a certain distance, which also has the app installed. This takes place between the phones themselves and its entirely anonymous.

The app registers a contact if the two people have been within a certain distance (less than 2m) of each other for a certain amount of time (more than 15 minutes), according to what is known about the transmission of Covid-19. No information is sent to the NHS or other bodies. If for any reason a person wishes to delete the app from the phone, all the data is also deleted. Similarly, if the app registers that someone you have met recently has been tested for Covid-19, it will tell you what you need to do.

People who do not have a smartphone will still be covered by the existing manual track and trace services, which will continue as at present.

TRACK AND TRACE

It is now a legal requirement that all parishioners and visitors attending Mass in the church will need to provide their surname and phone number (one member of each household). We are required by the Government to record details of all who attend church during the Covid-19 pandemic. The privacy impact of those whose personal data is recorded in the register is minimal because the register is kept securely and the information is divulged if required by the Government is only kept for 21 days and then shredded.

GUIDELINES FOR COMING TO CHURCH

It is important to remember that the Coronavirus is still out there, and lives are still at risk. We cannot afford to get complacent. We must all continue to play our part, follow the rules, protect our vulnerable people and control the spread. We are still living with a pandemic.

If someone comes to church and is then tested positive for the virus, the church must be closed for 72 hours.

Certain groups of people may be at risk from COVID19 including those who are aged 70 and above, regardless of medical conditions. If you are feeling unwell, please refrain from coming to Mass.

- The Sunday Obligation is still suspended.
- Masses are still available on websites.
- Confessions by appointments.
- Worshipers should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group. Rule of 6 applies at all times.

- Face coverings are mandatory in Church and all those attending must wear a face covering which should be kept on during the whole service - mouth and nose covered.

People want to feel safe and confident when coming back to Mass.
