REST IN PEACE

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We've read the commentaries and heard the homilies: "The poor widow is an example of generosity. You should be generous like her." I suspect many of us have heard that message often. But are we listening for other meanings? Sometimes, we become so familiar with this story that we accept the usual interpretations without seeking a deeper understanding. We might even anticipate its use to criticise the rich or to remind us of the unfair distribution of the world's resources. We know, after all, that so many live without basic needs—without enough money, food, shelter, education, healthcare.

While these interpretations are valid, there's something deeper in this story. This Gospel isn't only about the treasury of money; it's about the treasury of poverty.

God, grant me the riches of poverty, for in such largesse lies my power and glory.

Poverty is often seen as a problem to solve, but not in today's gospel. The poverty of the widow is not a problem but a virtue. The poor widow becomes our teacher, and we, her students.

We can't see Jesus until we see the widow and recognise her as one of us, not as someone apart from us.

The riches of poverty come from letting go—letting go of comparison, competition, and judgement; letting go of status, reputation, and control; letting go of illusions that make us feel better. Ultimately, it's about letting go of ourselves and those we love most.

This is where the poor widow lives, where God lives. In the face of the poor widow, Christ sees himself.
