## **REST IN PEACE**

We pray for the repose of the soul of John O'Connell who died recently, and for those who anniversaries occur at this time, may they rest in peace. Amen. Grace to you, peace from God our Father and Lord Jesus Christ.

In Luke 3:1-6, John the Baptist's public ministry begins with a call to prepare the way for Jesus. Luke grounds this moment in history by naming leaders like Tiberius Caesar and Pontius Pilate, showing that John's message would challenge both individuals and societal powers. John's mission fulfils Isaiah's prophecy: "Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low, and the crooked shall become straight, and the rough places shall become level ways, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." This imagery speaks of justice and inclusion, where obstacles to God are levelled, and all people can experience His grace equally. John preaches repentance and forgiveness, urging people to turn from sin and align with God's will. This transformation is both personal and collective—calling for societal change as much as individual renewal. "Prepare the way of the Lord" means more than belief; it demands active participation in making God's grace accessible. We are challenged to examine our hearts and lives, to remove obstacles in ourselves and our communities, to welcome God's salvation fully. This passage reminds us that God's path is open to all. John's call to "prepare" invites us to be active participants, to clear away what blocks us from God, so that His grace and salvation can reach everyone.

DID YOU KNOW... There are usually three main elements to the Advent wreath – holly, red berries, and evergreens. The evergreen represents the eternal life promised to us all in the coming of Christ. The most common of the evergreens is ivy, others include laurel which often signifies victory over persecution and suffering; pine, holly and yew, which signify immortality; and cedar, which denotes strength and healing. But, holly, with its prickly leaves and red berries, is also a reminder to us of Jesus's crown of thorns, the red berries representing the drops of His blood. As we contemplate Jesus's infancy we are also conscious of the shadow of the Cross. Finally, the circular wreath symbolises eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ, and, like a wedding ring, it has neither a beginning nor an end.
