Surely, a failure of humanity would be our inability to cope with the deep seated differences of opinion that somehow just seem to exist between ourselves. Very important issues get viewed in totally different ways and often this leads to hostility and sometimes even violence between ourselves. This in itself makes me wonder how many mistaken points of view there must be as when facts are examined there can only be one truth, as opposite cannot both be true. This is something for which I am eternally grateful. However, it would also be true to state that this truth would be meaningless without an understanding of my own starting point.

With myself, and indeed most of you who are reading this, that point would have been our own baptisms, which of course for most of us would have been as infants, but for some, that point would have come later in life. Our current and previous RCIA parishioners have certainly had to answer the "What shall I do" question. So could I ask each of you on this joyous Gaudete Sunday to remember our current RCIA candidates and catechumens in your prayers as they examine their own conscience to discern their future as Catholic Christians.
