SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint Francis de Sales, Bishop & Doctor (1567-1622) Memorial, January 24

"What we need is a cup of understanding, a barrel of love and an ocean of patience.".

As I write this, Gaza teeters on the edge of a peace deal; may our prayers continue for a positive, lasting outcome. It is a very poignant moment that nine of the Bishops of England and Wales, including two from our own Diocese - Bishop Nicholas Hudson and Bishop Jim Curry (our area Bishop) - embarked on a pilgrimage of solidarity to the Holy Land on Saturday. It is organised by the Holy Land Coordination, through the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, and is defined by four Ps - presence, prayer, pilgrimage, and pressure. Embarking on this year's pilgrimage of solidary, bringing these four Ps together, the bishops reaffirm to the Christians in the Holy Land that they are not forgotten, which, as Bishop Hudson underlined, is 'a moment to stand again alongside those who have endured unimaginable hardship. It will be a time to reaffirm our bond of communion with the Church in the Holy Land, and with all who suffer and are without hope.'

Bishop Nicholas continues: 'We look forward to returning, just weeks after Christmas, to the cradle of our faith, the land where Jesus was born and walked, died and was raised to new life, a land which will always remain of profound significance for all who form a part of Christ's body. The devastation of war and suffering in the Holy Land is heart-breaking. The trauma felt in the region, especially that of children, is beyond measure; and the need for prayer, support, and to find ways to end the violence has never been more urgent.'

Dear friends, we pray more deeply, on this Peace Sunday, for the success and safety of this pilgrimage, for enduring peace in the Holy Land and throughout our world. For as the opening prayer at Mass this weekend presents to us, 'Almighty and ever-living God, who govern all things, both in heaven and on earth, mercifully hear the pleading of your people and bestow your peace on our times.' Amen

Wishing you all a blessed and peaceful week ahead.

The CCP is certifying your Catholic Practice at Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation over several years and without this regular practice, regrettably, it is not possible for a CCP to be issued.

COFFEE MORNING – Thank you to Confirmation Group 1 and to all of you for your support at the Coffee morning last Sunday. An amazing £416.20 was raised towards the Youth Fund. Your cakes and service were amazing.

LOURDES IS CALLING - Like you, I love pilgrimages and especially pilgrimage to Lourdes, where my calling to priesthood was deeply realised. I hope we can begin to enjoy pilgrimages together beginning with our Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes on the 25th July to 1st August 2025.
