Dear Friends,

At the time of writing, the fragile peace in the Holy Land seems under threat from increasingly belligerent leadership in the west. And yet, as Catholics, we believe that every person is made in Gods image, with the consequence that if we see the image of God in every person, no matter their circumstance, then the women, men and children most vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice should not be hindered from living a life equal to their dignity. Or to put it a bit more succinctly, the innate dignity of each person is the foundation and inspiration of our vision for a just and compassionate world.

I am certain that those who live in poverty or those who live in war zones long for a different reality. The reality of poverty and war was as true in the time of Christ as it is today. That reality was already evident when Jesus preached to the crowds. But is is also true to state that Jesus did not curse the rich out of spite or hatred, however, he is declaring, in a generous way that it is hard to want a new heaven and a new earth when the one that we already have seems so satisfactory.

So if we are reasonably well off, successful and happy in this world, we may need to be reminded that we are poor before God, so please take a moment in your prayer lives to remember all those affected by war and all those who have had to migrate against their wishes to escape war. But perhaps, most of all, pray for our leaders, that they might consign belligerence to history and use their influence for the good of humanity and not just those who voted them into office.
