Saint Gregory of Narek, Father & Abbot of the Church (950-1003)

Memorial, February 27th "In the face of my darkness, You are light".

Dear Friends,

As we begin to tread the pilgrim way of this Jubilee Year, the theme of which is 'Pilgrims of Hope', we do so grafted onto Christ, the last Adam, [who] became for us a life-giving gift from heaven (1 Cor 15:45, 47). He is the very one who teaches us how to love, as presented in our Gospel this weekend, encouraging us to be 'loving Pilgrims of Hope.'

Many resources are available for this Jubilee Year, two of which I would commend to you at the early onset of this Jubilee; namely, 'Pilgrims of Hope: Our Journey Together Towards Racial Justice', published for Racial Justice Sunday last weekend, and Cardinal Vincent's homily for Mass in Honour of Our Lady of Lourdes 2025. I shall make both these resources available to you on the parish website. The sentence that stood out to me in the materials for Racial Justice Sunday was Bishop Paul McAleenan reminding us that 'Just as pilgrims must prepare for their journey and be properly equipped, we, too, need all that is necessary to propel us towards racial justice - the mind of Christ; examination of our progress and of the challenges that remain; a willingness to learn from one another together; and prayers for and on the journey.' This chimes beautifully with the Gospel Acclamation verse this weekend, 'A new commandment I give to you, says the Lord, that you love one another, just as I have loved you' (Jn 13:34).

This leads me to the second resource and a particular comment from Cardinal Vincent, who said in his homily, 'It was pointed out to me recently that a more accurate translation of this Jubilee motto is that we are 'Pilgrims into Hope'. In the framework of our faith, the deeper meaning of hope is that its fulfilment actually lies ahead. True hope lies in a firm and unshakeable hope for heaven. In this regard, hope is the daughter of faith and, ultimately, we set our course through life by this faith and hope. Today we come in prayer to strengthen this hope, to be together, to learn again, through the wonder of the Mass, how deeply we belong to one another.'

Dear friends, Christ is our hope. May we learn from Him so as to live and love, together, on our pilgrim way back to our Father.

LOURDES IS CALLING - Like you, I love pilgrimages and especially pilgrimage to Lourdes, where my calling to priesthood was deeply realised. I hope we can begin to enjoy pilgrimages together beginning with our Diocesan Pilgrimage to Lourdes on the 25th July to 31st July 2025. It would be great to have a large parish contingent during this 'Jubilee Year', where we can take our parishioners, especially the sick, to Jesus, through our Lady of Lourdes and St Bernadette. I would also encourage our young parishioners – 16-years upwards - to consider volunteering as Redcaps (those helping the sick, especially those in wheelchairs), nurses and doctors of our parish volunteering their skills, and other parishioners to consider volunteering to work in St Frai - the care facility we use for our diocesan sick pilgrims. I also hope we can engage with some fundraising to offset some of the costs of the pilgrimage. If you are interested please contact the Parish Office!

LENT CATECHESIS ON 'THE MASS' - Fr Mike will run a six-session course on 'The Mass', by Bishop Robert Barron, to accompany us through Lent. The course will be weekly on a Friday evening at 6.30pm to 8.00pm, in the Parish Centre, beginning **Friday 7th March 2025**. As the course materials remind us, this course helps us to examine 'this most privileged and intimate encounter with our Lord, Jesus Christ. See how the Mass brings us out of the fallen world and into the heavenly realm, how it revolves around a call from God and a response from his people, the Church, and most importantly, how we are intimately joined with the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus through the Holy Eucharist.' The maximum capacity we can hold is 80, so please sign up for the course as soon as possible via the Parish Office.

SMALL FAITH-SHARING GROUP - Every Monday during Lent, starting **from 10th March** there will be a small faith-sharing group in the Presbytery after the 9.30am Mass.
