NO ONE CONFERS SACRED POWER ON HIMSELF

Last Sunday, May 18th, the Conferral of the Insignia of the Petrine Office on Pope Leo XIV was carried out at the Mass of Inauguration of the Ministry of the Bishop of Rome. This was done by three Cardinals representing the Orders in the Cardinalate and various continents of the world. Cardinal Dominique Mamberti (France) representing Europe and the Order of Cardinal Deacons conferred Pope Leo with the Pallium. Cardinal Fridolin Ambongo Besungu (DRC Congo) representing Africa and the Order of Cardinal Priests said the prayer of the conferral of the Pallium. Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle (Philippines) representing Asia and the Order of Cardinal Bishops conferred Pope Leo with the Fisherman's Ring. This was followed by the Rite of Obedience. Various persons selected from the People of God (Cardinals, Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Religious, and Lay Faithful) came forward to pay their respects and pledge obedience to the new Vicar of Christ, Successor of the Apostle Peter, and Bishop of Rome. Confirmed in Heaven, Sealed on Earth.

The Pope is the Vicar of Christ and Supreme Pastor of the Universal Church. Above the Pope, there is no earthly principality. His words carry a weight commensurate with his standing as the bridge in the long chain of faith and history that stretches back 2,000 years to Peter and to Christ. But despite the immensity of his sacred power, Pope Leo XIV could not confer on himself the symbols of his new office. He had to receive it from another. The Pallium was "conferred" on him. The Fisherman's Ring was "conferred" on him. He could not take the Pallium and just wear it on himself. He had to bow his head and receive it from another. He could not just pick the Fisherman's Ring and slide it into his finger. He had to stretch his finger and allow someone else wear it in for him. That is how things operate in the spiritual and sacramental order. No one, no matter how strong or powerful, confers a spiritual or sacramental gift on himself. For instance, you cannot baptise yourself, you cannot ordain yourself, you cannot confirm yourself, you cannot anoint yourself, you cannot marry yourself, you cannot absolve yourself of your sins, you always submit yourself to receive the gift of God from another. The sacred power and authority that God confers on his servants are always mediated through another. That is the mystery of the Church, and it is a call to humility.

PENTECOST SUNDAY 8TH JUNE - This is also the day of our parish Confirmations when we welcome Bishop James Curry. The Confirmation Masses will be at 2.30pm and 5.30pm. As it will be very tight to have the 7pm Mass, and rather than cancel the Mass we plan to have an additional Vigil Mass on Saturday 7th June at 6.30pm, which will be straight after the usual 5pm Mass. Apologies for any inconvenience.

WEEKDAY EVENING MASSES - Thank you to all those who have expressed their hope for a weekday evening Mass. Your experience, voice and the expression of your hopes for our parish are essential, especially when there is a new parish priest and assistant parish priest in town. They help us to understand more deeply our role as your shepherds, as experience the 'thirsts' amongst parishioners. The Parish Team have discussed this and, so, from the 1st June there will be two evening Masses per week, at 7.00pm on a Tuesday and Friday. Much thought was given to timings and we feel it prudent to align these Mass times to that of the Vigil for a Solemnity (and our now established Sunday evening Mass), whilst taking into account the need to remain accessible to shift workers. Please do spread this news of these newly established weekday Masses.

CATECHESIS CORNER - Following the success of the Lent programme and other teaching and formation opportunities that have arisen in the past six months, such as the three sessions for the parents and guardians of our Confirmation candidates, the new Baptismal Preparation Programme and, the soon to be launched, Marriage Preparation Programme, the thirst for catechesis *[cat-eh-key-sis]* appears to be rising. Pope St John Paul II said that 'catechesis is an education of children, young people and adults in the faith, which includes especially the teachings of Christian doctrine imparted, generally speaking, in an organic and systematic way, with a view to initiating the hearers into the fulness of Christ's life. Its purpose is to develop a living, explicit and active faith, enlightened by doctrine.' Pope Francis reminds us that catechesis comes from the Greek for 'echo' and, as such, emphasises that catechesis is an 'echo of the Word of God', in which the ministry of teaching and formation helps us to understand more the truth and beauty of the faith, as well as to be able to live it more abundantly and communicate it to others. So, from 1st June, there will be a section in the weekly newsletter oriented to a particular catechesis; this section will be named Catechesis Corner. To help us to develop this for the future, if you have any questions that you would like us to help form an answer to, that we can use in this catechesis, please send them to us via the parish office. We hope you enjoy this new adventure of faith formation.
