Dear Friends,

Last Sunday, Carlos Acutis, who has been called "Gods influencer" by Pope Francis was canonised by Pope Leo in Rome. St Carlos Acutis was born in London in 1991 and was baptised in the church of Our Lady of Dolours in Chelsea, but moved to Milan with his family whilst he was still a baby. He died in Monza, Italy on October 12th 2006 from leukaemia.

His life, was of course by anyone's standards tragically short. But surely, it is what he achieved in his life that is relevant. He was volunteering in his parish as a catechist at the age of 12, no doubt leading the catechism of his peers. I recently read a report attributed to his parish priest of the time who said that Carlos was able to apply himself equally to his catechism class and to his school studies and particularly to computer science.

But surely more important that all of the above was his devotion to the Eucharist, in which he demonstrated to us on his website where he documented Eucharistic miracles.

Carlos would have understood that the starting point for Eucharistic spirituality is the table of the Lord Jesus. Carlos would have understood that The Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian life. Carlos would have understood that the other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented towards it.

The risen Lord has taught and nourished his followers at the table of His Body and Blood throughout the ages, and indeed continues to send them forth to

throughout the ages, and indeed continues to send them forth to continue his mission of proclaiming the Good News and building the reign of God. The table is central to our faith as Catholic Christians because it is at the table, (as it was for the disciples journeying on the road to Emmaus) that Christ makes himself known to us in "The Breaking of Bread."

CATECHESIS CORNER

Reverence During Holy Communion

We are continuing our lesson this week on the proper conduct expected of Catholics when they receive Holy Communion.

- 1. It is required that Catholics abstain from food and drinks before receiving Holy Communion. According to the 1983 Code of Canon Law, no. 919, "Whoever is to receive the blessed Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before Holy Communion from all food and drink, with the sole exception of water and medicine." This implies that taking medication or drinking plain water during the one-hour fasting period is acceptable. Notably, the canon requires "at least one hour." This is meant to motivate us to fast for a longer duration before Holy Communion, going above and beyond the legal limit. Regretfully, some people have been observed coming to receive Holy Communion while chewing food or bubble gum. That is not right.
- 2. It is advised that we practise good personal hygiene before receiving Holy Communion, including brushing our teeth and, in fact, keeping our entire body clean. Aside being a sign of respect to Jesus, present in body, soul and divinity in the Holy Eucharist, it is good for our health.

APPLICATION TO SECONDARY SCHOOL Certificate of Catholic Practice (CCP) - To be issued with a CCP an applicant must meet the eligibility criteria. The CCP is certifying that you live within the parish boundary or that this is your regular place of worship, and certifying your Catholic Practice at Sunday Masses and Holy Days of Obligation over several years. Without this regular practice, regrettably, it is not possible for a CCP to be issued. If you have moved to the parish in the past two years, then please ask for a letter from your former Parish Priest stating your practice, to accompany your application. If you meet the criteria outlined above, please book a ten-minute appointment with Florie, in person, and pick up an application pack at the same time. Then, if you meet the criteria, complete the Self-Assessment Form and the CCPs (one for each Catholic school you are applying for) in your application pack, bringing them and other relevant documents to your meeting with Father Mike. The parish office is very busy and we ask that you only make the bookings at the times advertised below, and this must be done in person, not by phone or email.

Booking dates and times with Florie in Church porch: 19/9 3-3.45pm and 22/9 8.30-9am. You will then be given an appointment time with Father Mike.

Individual meetings with Father Mike, dates and times: 26/09 1-5pm (FULL); 07/10 11.30am – 3pm and 17/10 1-5pm.
