Securing the long-term care of our church

Our recent diocesan buildings survey shows that our ageing lighting system will need to be replaced in the next 2 -5 years. This will be an opportunity for us to replace the lighting system with one which is eco-friendly, as well as economically viable.

Forming disciples

The three pillars of ongoing formation that we wish to promote for St Lawrence's are the Youth, Liturgy and Pilgrimage Funds. In this way, we hope to reach out to parishioners of all ages, continuing to be a missionary and outreach parish.

Enhancing our liturgical encounter

We are blessed that our church has stunning stoneware, oriented to our liturgical celebrations; the Altar and Tabernacle, the font, the Stations of the Cross, the top of the columns in church. Our vision is to replace the lectern and ambo (readers and celebrants' stations) with similar stone, drawing us into a more functional and focussed Sanctuary space.

Why maintenance of our Church building matters...

Our church is beautiful and it enriches our worship, and enhances the quality of the spiritual and sacramental life of our parishioners. Quite simply it is cherished. We look after this church not only for us, but for our children, and their children, so that they are able to inherit this beautiful sanctuary.

Through small regular investments in maintenance we are able to conserve what has been passed into our guardianship. We accept that we cannot stop decay, only slow it down, but we are able to minimise the risk of extensive high-cost repairs through regular maintenance: the regular cleaning of gutters and our drains is astronomically cheaper than having to replace the nave roof due to dry rot and water ingress for example that might arise following years of neglect.

Over the coming 5 years we are anticipating that we will need to spend £214,300 to maintain our church site.


Our Offertory income: How we resource our church

Giving efficiently: Why Standing Orders are so helpful

- Improves the regularity and consistency of church income
- Saves the parish time and money spent counting and banking cash loose plate donations
- Helps us to budget and manage our finances more effectively, and bank statements provide an independent audit trail for the Inland Revenue



DID YOU KNOW... If everyone who can Gift Aid their donations did so, our parish would raise thousands of pounds more per year, at no cost to the donor!

How can Gift Aid help our church?

Gift Aid is a government scheme that allows us to reclaim the basic rate tax you pay as a UK taxpayer. It means that we can claim 25p of tax for every £1 you donate at no extra cost to you. All you need to do is make a Gift Aid declaration.



Common Gift Aid Myths busted:

- The Government will NOT look into Immigration Status
- You will NOT have to do any more paperwork after signing up
- Your taxes will NOT change if you Gift Aid
- If you are a pensioner, you CAN still Gift Aid If you have a taxable income stream

Gift Aid is easy to do, it doesn't cost you a penny and helps the parish even further!

- 18% of donations were Gift Aided in 2024.
- In 2024, 166 out of 1578 parishioners Gift Aided.
- If you pay UK income tax, you are able to sign up to Gift Aid.
- Gift Aid allows us to receive an extra 25p for every £1 you donate!
