#### Dear Friends

Our beloved patron Saint Lawrence informs us that Deacons have been present since the earliest times, appointed by the Apostles to assist with caring for the poor, and the practical organisation of the Church. Although often seen as a step in preparation for priesthood, the Church in recent times has recognised the importance of the role of the Permanent Deacon, as the sign of Christ the Servant in the Church and the wider community, which is why Deacons are ordained to serve the Church in a threefold ministry.

#### The Ministry of Charity

Deacons are particularly called to serve the poor, the vulnerable and the marginalised. They will coordinate the local church's response to their needs. They will have a special care for matters of social justice and they will foster and support parish groups and organisations.

The Ministry of the Word

They will proclaim the Gospel and sometimes preach at Mass and other Religious Services, but they can also preside over services other than the Mass. They can lead the people in Prayer, for example, officiating at Funeral and Burial Services.

The Ministry of the Altar

The Deacon will offer Service at the altar at Mass assisting the Bishop or Priest. He will distribute Holy Communion at Mass, in hospital and in the homes of the sick, the housebound and the dying. He can baptise and prepare people for the Sacrament of Baptism. He can officiate at Marriages and particularly in our

parish prepare couples for that Sacrament of Marriage. However, none of this would be possible without your support. So please as we continue with our Planned Giving Drive, give a moment or two to consider how best you can support the work of the Deacons, Priests and our wonderful lay people, as they continue the mission of St Lawrence here in 21st Century Feltham.

## **CATECHESIS CORNER**

Today's Gospel is striking! Only one of the ten lepers Jesus healed, from one particular village community, turned to give thanks and praise to God, falling at the feet of Jesus. Our Lord's message at the end of this dialogue, to this one, is very clear, 'Rise and go on your way; your faith has made you well.' This passage of the Gospel helps us to focus on what the Catechism refers to as 'the fruits of Holy Communion,' and thanksgiving for these. When we look at sections 1391 - 1398 of the Catechist of the Catholic Church, especially, we see that 'intimate union with Christ Jesus' is the greatest fruit of Holy Communion: 'Life in Christ has its foundation in the Eucharistic banquet.' Closely linked to his, however, is our relationship with the community around us, in that 'when [we] receive the Body of the Son, [we] proclaim to one another the Good News that the first fruits of life have been given, as when the angel said to Mary Magdalene, 'Christ is risen!' Now too are life and resurrection conferred on whoever receives Christ' (CCC1391). Other fruits of Holy Communion include the nourishment we receive - 'the bread for our pilgrimage', as we go on our way – the strengthening of our charity, helping us to break away from mortal sin, increasing our commitment to the poor, to name a few. This is why it is important to participate as fully as we can in the Eucharist, returning to the Lord, always giving thanks and praise to God for this gift, and so encourage each other to exclaim, as St Augustine did, 'O sacrament of devotion! O sign of unity! O bond of charity!' (CCC 1398).

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF THE EUCHARIST - There will be a meeting for all Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist who take Communion to the sick or housebound on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> October at 10am.
