The Lateran Basilica sits around 8.5 kilometres South-East of St Peters Basilica, in Rome, and it is the official Cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, now Pope Leo XIV. Its official dedication is The Papal Archbasilica of St John Lateran.

As in all Cathedrals, the seat of the bishop of that particular Cathedral is known as a 'cathedra', which signifies the role and authority of the bishop as spiritual leader, teacher, pastor and father to his diocese. As the materials for the Lateran Basilica underline, and particular to the Pope in this case, 'from the *cathedra*, the Pontiff who is seated there does not teach himself; he does not state his own opinions, but rather the Word of God, whom he serves so that it may shine before all.' This is what our Bishop, Cardinal Vincent does, for whom we pray in a special way, as he celebrates his 80<sup>th</sup> Birthday this weekend.

For us, here in the Diocese of Westminster, the *cathedra* of our Cathedral is modelled on the *cathedra* in the Lateran Basilica, Rome, which the then Archbishop of Westminster (Cardinal Vaughan) and the architect (John Francis Bentley) chose specifically as a means of expressing a continuity with early tradition, a communion with Rome. It is this communion with 'Mother Church' which strengthens the call for us in Westminster – for us here in St Lawrence, Feltham - to be a 'living' missionary Church, a home to all, built on the solid foundations of the Sacraments and the Word of God. As our Psalmist beautifully sums up for us, 'I have chosen and consecrated this house, says the Lord, that my name may be there forever.'

### CATECHESIS CORNER

The ordinary minister of confirmation is reserved to the Bishop in the Latin Rite - the Rite we follow - mindful that the Bishops are the successors of the Apostles. However, in certain situations, like the Easter Vigil or as many parishes experienced during the COVID pandemic, the Bishops can grant to priests the necessary permissions to celebrate confirmations. As the Catechism tells us, the administration of confirmation is ordinarily undertaken by the bishop, which 'demonstrates clearly that its effect is to unite those who receive it more closely to the Church, to her apostolic origins and to her mission of bearing witness to Christ' (CCC 1313). Often the Bishop will ask a person why they have chosen their particular confirmation name (I wonder why you chose your confirmation name?), after which he lays his hands on their head, calling down the Holy Spirit, then anoints the person on the forehead with sacred Chrism (a sweet smelling balsam), saying the words 'be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit' linked to the gifts of the Holy Spirit we mentioned last week (CCC 1320). They conclude by offering each other a sign of peace.
