This small, beautiful crib scene at our Westminster Cathedral, with its light dominating the darkness, draws us into these final days leading to Christmas, our parish hearts beating alongside the heartbeat of our Mother Cathedral. The empty manger calls to us to fill it with our prayers, with our hopes, fears, struggles, joys – all that life brings us - ready for our Infant King to absorb them into his transformative Divine presence.

We do so today, against another backdrop of news for the Archdiocese of Westminster. Pope Leo XIV has, on Friday, accepted the resignation of the pastoral care of our diocese presented by Cardinal Vincent Nichols, who recently turned 80 years old. At the same time, Pope Leo has given our diocese another Shepherd, Archbishop-elect Richard Moth, now formerly the Bishop of Arundel & Brighton. More details will be communicated over the coming weeks, but, for now, we keep Cardinal Vincent in our prayers at the crib, in thanksgiving for his ministry to us, as we pray also for Archbishop-elect Richard, preparing to soon welcome him to the Archdiocese of Westminster.

To you, my dear brothers and sisters, parishioners and friends of St Lawrence parish, may I take this opportunity, on behalf of Father Andrew, our Deacons, the Parish Team, and myself, to wish you all a joyful, holy and blessed Christmas, when it soon arrives, and may the Joy of the World, Christ Our Light, implant into your hearts the peace, hope and love from His Bethlehem manger, forever.

We offer him our huge congratulations and assurance of our prayers as he prepares to transition to his new role in our diocese. Archbishop-elect Richard will be installed on Saturday 14th February 2026, with further details to come.

**ADVENT CONFESSIONS** - Father Mike or Father Andrew will offer confession times this coming week, before Christmas, on the following dates and times: Tuesday 23rd December, 10.00-11.00am & 5.30-6.30pm. These are in addition to the usual Saturday confessions 10.15 – 11.15am & 4.00-5.00pm.

**CHRISTMAS MASSES** - Children are invited to come dressed as a character from the Nativity at at whatever Mass you attend. If you would like to make a card for Baby Jesus to put in the crib, bring it to Mass.

BELLS AT MASS - DID YOU KNOW? - The main reason for bells to be rung at Mass is to draw ones attention that something sacred is happening. The first bell tells us that the sacredness of Mass has begun, we all stand. The second set of bells is at the point called the Epiclesis, when the priest calls down the power of the Holy Spirit, beginning the sacred period of consecration; here we are kneeling in reverence to this Holy and miraculous moment. The third and fourth set of bells are rung at the moment of transubstantiation, when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus, the real presence of Jesus amongst us; we remain kneeling. The fifth bell is when the priest consumes the precious Body and Blood of Jesus. Many people think this bell is an indication that they should sit in their seat. Rather, given that this is a continuity of this sacred moment in the Mass, we would remain kneeling, with the bell alerting us to the fact that soon each of us will come forward to receive the Body of Christ.

If you feel your child is getting irritable or distracted, again, do not worry, and feel free to take them to the porch or outside to settle them down, but remember to come back in, come back to your church home. We have often found that having the children close to the front of the church not only helps them to focus on everything that is happening on the Sanctuary, it also keeps them interested, distraction-free. So, again, we welcome you and your families to the front of church for as full a participation at Mass as possible. Parents and Guardians, you are the first and best teachers of the faith, and we encourage you and support you in your vocation.
