When Jesus first said those words of the Beatitudes in our gospel reading today (Matthew 5:1–12a), the people who first heard Him must have been as bewildered as many of us now. Jesus referred to those who mourn, those who hunger and thirst, those who are persecuted as “Happy”. However, as we know, these categories of people cannot be deemed joyful by world standards. Jesus reversed the prevailing beliefs and attitudes in our society and wants us his disciples to imbibe traits and qualities that completely contradict traditional standards and ideals of happiness in the world.

Jesus teaches that “true happiness” or “blessedness”, consists in sharing the very life of God, seeking God and becoming what St Peter called “partakers in the divine nature” (2 Pet 1:4). This is the glorious end that we are called to, and it is in as much as we possess this that we possess happiness in this life, and in its fullness in the life to come. The beatitudes tell us who God intends to bless: the poor, the lowly, the hungry, and the persecuted, and that God is always thinking about the least and the last among us.

## CATECHESIS CORNER

The Catechism underlines that the Eucharist is 'the source and summit of the Christian life' (CCC 1324). Whenever I think of summit, my memory transports me to the many hills and mountains I have ascended throughout my life, especially the ones I have struggled to climb. Here, I am reminded that we need encouragement, accompaniment and help when we struggle to climb to a summit, both as the one to give that help and receive it, when necessary. This, again, underscores the need to live in communion with each other, to help each other on the pilgrim way. The Eucharist, then, is '...that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being' (CCC 1325). At the Last Supper, Jesus broke bread and shared the chalice 'in communion' with those gathered, and 'because Jesus used this rite, part of the Jewish meal, when as master of the table he blessed and distributed the bread...It is by this action that his disciples will recognise him after the Resurrection, and it is this expression that the first Christians will use to designate their Eucharistic assemblies, but doing so they signify that all who eat the one broken bread, Christ, enter into communion with him and form but one body in him' (CCC 1329). Here we see the importance of the rites we use at Mass and in other liturgies, given to us by Holy Mother Church, and our participation in them, together. But also, it highlights the need to stand with each other, shoulder to shoulder, and help each other climb the summit of the pilgrim way. If two yoked oxen, although linked together, walk out of step with each other, the work is heavier, their unity risks being broken. Thus, as we pray in Eucharistic Prayer 3, 'grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ.'

**CARDINAL VINCENT'S MASS OF THANKSGIVING** - This will take place on **Thursday 5th February, 5.30pm**, at Westminster Cathedral, Victoria, and will be an opportunity to celebrate the ministry of Cardinal Vincent as Archbishop of Westminster, praying for him as he enters retirement. This is not a ticketed event and I encourage as many of you as possible to attend this wonderful Mass of Thanksgiving.

**CONFESSIONS 14th FEBRUARY** - Due to the timing of the Installation Mass for Archbishop-Elect Richard, regrettably, we will need to cancel confessions this day. However, there will be an hour for confession transferred to **Friday 13th February at 5.30pm**. Thank you for your understanding.

We studied breathing techniques and fun vocal warm-ups leading to extended learning of the musical 'Godspell' and some stand alone great songs. ~The group worked beautifully together on harmonising and listening to each other and the concert that we performed to friends and family in December was very well received.

We would like to expand the group and there are spaces available if you wish to join. Adults only, no audition and all are welcome. The next Meeting is on Monday 2nd February.

The costs will be £1,216 per person, based on two sharing. Single rooms are also available at a supplement. We will also undertake some fundraising in the coming months to reduce the prices.
