Most of us do not spend our days performing extraordinary acts of faith. Yet it is precisely here that God can call us to holiness. As St Peter reminds us, “he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct” (1 Peter 1:15).

St Josemaría Escrivá teaches us that “Our ordinary activities are not an insignificant matter. Rather they are the very hinge on which our sanctity turns and they offer us constant opportunities of meeting God” (St. Josemaria Escriva). Our work, our jobs do not turn us away from achieving holiness but are the very place where it can grow. These ordinary duties become opportunities to meet God, to glorify Him and to allow Christ to work through us.

The key is love. When our work is done not merely to succeed or to be noticed but as an offering to God, it becomes an encounter with Christ. We must imitate Christ’s own love and service in our lives, by being patient with others, aiding our colleagues, a simply smile and ‘how are you?’.

In this way, we present Christ to the world not only through Scripture but through our actions, a quiet witness of lives lived faithfully each day. Holiness, is closer than we think, waiting for us in the ordinary moments of our lives.

CATECHESIS CORNER

The reception of Holy Communion in the Catholic Church is built upon the principles of being prepared to receive, this includes the work of God's grace and freedom from grave sin. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1385) states "to respond to this invitation we must prepare ourselves for so great and so holy a moment". We shall be focussing on behaviours that Catholics ought to exhibit when approaching a Priest, Deacon or Extra Ordinary Minister to partake in Holy Communion during Mass.

1. For those who receive Holy Communion on the hand, you are asked to place one hand over the other in the shape of a cross. Again, we do not take from the Extra Ordinary Minister; instead, we wait for them to place in our hand. We should also be aware that our hands should be clear to receive and should not be holding a handkerchief, keys, or anything else. Once in our hand, we are to consume reverently and then return to our seat. We are not allowed to return to our seat with the body of Christ or even take home as this will be a sacrilege.

2. The Code of Canon Law, Number 230 paragraph 3 states: "When the need of the Church warrants it ... lay persons, ... can also ... distribute Holy Communion...". Despite this instruction, it has been observed that some Catholics receive Holy Communion exclusively from the priest and would not receive from the Extra Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. It is pertinent to know that Jesus is present in Holy Communion, whether we receive from the priest or the Extra Ordinary Minister. Avoiding an Extra Ordinary Minister during Holy Communion is disrespectful to their person and above all disrespectful to Jesus.

ARCHBISHOP-ELECT RICHARD'S INSTALLATION -

Parishes have been invited to make an application for two events that will mark the installation of our new Archbishop. The first is to Vespers (Evening Prayer) on Friday 13th February at 5.30pm and the second is to the Installation Mass itself on **Saturday 14th February at 12noon**, both events at Westminster Cathedral, Victoria. Parishes can apply for two tickets for Vespers and one ticket for the Installation Mass. The deadline for applications is this Monday, 26th February, so, if you are interested, please speak with Father Mike ASAP. These are ticketed events only.

CARDINAL VINCENT'S MASS OF THANKSGIVING - This will take place on **Thursday 5th February, 5.30pm**, at Westminster Cathedral, Victoria, and will be an opportunity to celebrate the ministry of Cardinal Vincent as Archbishop of Westminster, praying for him as he enters retirement. This is not a ticketed event and I encourage as many of you as possible to attend this wonderful Mass of Thanksgiving.

CONFESSIONS 14th FEBRUARY - Due to the timing of the Installation Mass for Archbishop-Elect Richard, regrettably, we will need to cancel confessions this day. However, there will be an hour for confession transferred to **Friday 13th February at 5.30pm**. Thank you for your understanding.

The beautiful expression that this instrument will create for our liturgies will be fantastic and, so, I extend our huge thanks to the donor for this wonderful and extremely generous gift.

LOURDES PILGRIMAGE 2026, FROM HEATHROW - If you would like to go to Lourdes this year on the diocesan pilgrimage, with our new Archbishop, please give your details to the parish office ASAP. **The dates are 17th – 24th July.** This year, our parish has been offered return flights from Heathrow, which is so convenient for us, staying full board in the 4-star Padoue Hotel, minutes from the Grotto, including coach transfers from Toulouse Airport (our arrival airport) to Lourdes and travel insurance and pilgrimage levy. The costs will be £1,216 per person, based on two sharing. Single rooms are also available at a supplement. We will also undertake some fundraising in the coming months to reduce the prices.
